

PrEP 101 - The Basics

PrEP stands for Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis

The word "prophylaxis" means to prevent or control the spread of an infection or disease.

PrEP is a HIV prevention option that works by taking



PrEP can help prevent you from getting HIV if you are exposed to the virus.



- How Does it Work?

Some of the same medicines prescribed for the treatment of HIV In PrEP studies, the risk of getting HIV infection from <u>sexual contact or injection</u> <u>drug use</u> was much lower - <u>up to 92% lower for sexual contact, and 70% lower</u> <u>for injection drug use</u> - for those who took the medicines consistently.

can also be prescribed for its prevention.

LOWER RISK FOR HIV FROM INJECTION DRUG USE

When taken everyday, PrEP can provide a high level of protection against HIV, and is even more effective when it is combined with condoms and other prevention tools.



People who use PrEP must take the medicine EVERY DAY and return to their health care provider every 3 months for follow-up and prescription refills.
