BSS LEVEL II DIRECT TREATMENT



Direct implementation of treatment plans, behavior intervention procedures, skill acquisition procedures and positive behavior support plans by a Registered Behavior Technician (RBT) or an Intensive Behavior Assistant (IBA).

Registered Behavior Technician:

An RBT is a paraprofessional certification in behavior analysis. RBTs must meet certain qualifications as outlined by the Behavior Analyst Certification Board (BACB). RBTs must also take specific training and pass an examination to obtain certification. RBTs must also be supervised according to BACB standards Provided here: BACB - Behavior Analyst Certification Board

Intensive Behavior Assistant:

IBA is an alternative qualification that can deliver Level II BSS. IBAs must also be under the supervision of a Board-Certified Behavior Analyst-Doctoral (BCBA-D), Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA), or Board-Certified Assistant Behavior Analyst (BCaBA). To be qualified as an IBA one of the following training requirements must be met:

- · National Association of Dual Diagnosis (NADD) Certification OR
- The first 3 tiers of <u>Mandt</u> (Tier 1: Relational, Tier 2: Conceptual, Tier 3: Technical) AND the following courses through <u>AAIDD</u> (American Association on Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities)
 - o Managing Challenging Behaviors Focused Learning
 - o Principles of Positive Behavior Support for DSP's
 - o Part 1: Overview
 - o Part 2: Teaching Functional Skills
 - o Part 3: How to Teach People with Disabilities
 - o Part 4: Importance of Behavior Support Plans (BSPs)
