	Subject: Purpose

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The Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities (BHDD) Division Non-Medicaid Services Provider Manual for Substance Use Disorders (SUD) and Adult Mental Health provides information pertaining to non-Medicaid behavioral health services.. These services are outlined in the Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities Division, Medicaid Services Provider Manual for Substance Use Disorder and Adult Mental Health on the BHDD website at: <https://dphhs.mt.gov/amdd/AMDDMedicaidServicesProviderManual>.

Non-Medicaid Substance Use Disorder

- (1) Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment (SABG) Block Grant funding is available to individuals 0-200% Federal Poverty Level (FPL) as follows:
 - (a) 139-200% FPL and is not otherwise Medicaid eligible; and
 - (b) 0-200% FPL and the service is not a Medicaid covered service.

- (2) Individuals 139-200% FPL, who are not otherwise Medicaid eligible, may receive the following Medicaid covered SUD services:
 - (a) SUD Medically Monitored Intensive Inpatient (ASAM 3.7), Adult;
 - (b) SUD Medically Monitored High Intensity Inpatient (ASAM 3.7), Adolescent;
 - (c) SUD Clinically Managed High-Intensity Residential (ASAM 3.5), Adult;
 - (d) SUD Clinically Managed Medium-Intensity Residential (ASAM 3.5), Adolescent;
 - (e) SUD Clinically Managed Population-specific High-intensity Residential (ASAM 3.3), Adult;

- (f) SUD Clinically Managed Residential Withdrawal Management (ASAM 3.2-WM), Adult;
- (g) SUD Clinically Managed Low-Intensity Residential (ASAM 3.1), Adult and Adolescent;
- (h) SUD Partial Hospitalization (ASAM2.5), Adult and Adolescent;
- (i) SUD Intensive Outpatient (IOP) Therapy (ASAM 2.1), Adult and Adolescent;
- (j) SUD Targeted Case Management;
- (k) SUD Outpatient Therapy;
- (l) Community Based Psychiatric Rehabilitation and Support Services (CBPRS);
- (m) SUD Certified Behavioral Health Peer Support Services (CBHPSS) – Individual; and
- (n) Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT).

Non-Medicaid Mental Health

(1) State funding for behavioral health crisis services is available to individuals 139-150% FPL, who are not otherwise Medicaid eligible, may receive the following Medicaid covered crisis services:

- (a) crisis assessment and psychotherapy;
- (b) Targeted Case Management;
- (c) Crisis Receiving Program; and
- (d) Crisis Stabilization Program.
