

Near-Term Initiatives | Summary

Near-Term Initiatives (NTIs) reflect common sense, actionable ideas to address largely known and worsening gaps in Montana's behavioral health and developmental disabilities systems. DPHHS can begin implementing these NTIs now, in parallel with developing its final Report. Upon Commission recommendation and approval by the Governor, DPHHS can begin implementing these NTIs now while the Commission continues development of its final report.





Near-Term Initiatives | Progress Update and Next Steps

The Commission approved two NTIs at its meeting in October: a grant program for providers of residential settings, and a grant program for communities to accelerate forensic court ordered-evaluations. These NTIs are described below, along with status updates and anticipated next steps.
