Is our health care system ready to serve older individuals with disabilities as we baby boomers enter our 70s, 80s, and 90s? Do most health care providers understand their responsibilities under the ADA? Does your state have an American Indian VR Services (AIVRS) program, which is also known as the Section 121 Program? Public Law 102-477, which is not new, may have an impact on these programs in your state. This 477 action allows Tribes to consolidate various federal funded programs such as employment assistance, higher education and or general assistance. There are some Tribal Programs that have or may be contemplating including their Tribal VR dollars with other workforce dollars per 477. There appear to be various opinions as to what would be the impact on 121 programs and their customers if a Tribal program would elect to co-mingle the AIVRS dollars per 477.

This just came on our radar at CSAVR and we would appreciate hearing any thoughts you may have on this and thanks.

CSAVR WORK

CSAVR has signed off on a letter in partnership with the National Association of State Workforce Agencies (NASWA) and the National Association of State Directors of Adult Education (NASDAE) urging the speedy re-establishment of the Federal Employment Data Exchange System, or FEDES. We understand several Federal agencies are partnering to re-establish FEDES and wish to encourage their work. FEDES was suspended in early 2018. We are supporting this because we understand that a re-established FEDES will help VR agencies supplement State UI and

SWIS data as these sources do not include Federal employment or USPS employment.

TIP OF THE EDITION

Are you keeping your back up audit documentation handy? You may want to do that through your next 107 Monitoring cycle. In the current 2024 Monitoring cycle one of the RSA review teams asked an agency to not only provide proof from their auditor that they made a needed correction and also the agency's supporting documentation as to the correction.

CSAVR YES/LMS WEBINARS

We hope you enjoyed the series of three free webinars that CSAVR partnered with YES/LMS to offer in 2023. These webinars are recorded, will be captioned, ASL interpreters, and housed on the CSAVR Yes/LMS page for others to view and receive CRC credits. Want to thank all the presenters and all of you who tuned in for these webinars. We had over 1,800 register for these sessions. While the evaluations from the final webinar have not been tabulated yet, an average of 96% of the respondents agreed or strongly agreed that the webinars were helpful.

OSERS & RSA UPDATE

DOE has published an Education Department General Administrative Regulations (EDGAR) [Notice of Proposed Rulemaking \[federalregister.gov\]](#) (NPRM) in the Federal Register. Comments regarding the NPRM must be submitted electronically via the Federal eRulemaking Portal at [www.regulations.gov \[regulations.gov\]](#). The last major update to EDGAR was in 2013. Given that EDGAR serves as a foundational set of regulations, the Department reviewed EDGAR, evaluated it for provisions that, over time, have become outdated, unnecessary, or inconsistent with other Department regulations, and identified ways in which EDGAR could be updated, streamlined, and otherwise improved. Specifically, the Department proposes to amend parts 75, 76, 77, 79, and 299 of [title 34 of the Code of Federal Regulations \[ecfr.gov\]](#).

ACL's expansion of public access requirements will be described in a new ACL Public Access Policy, which will be released by December 31, 2024, and implemented by December 31, 2025.
