

BEST BEGINNINGS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Supporting Montana Families and Providers with Child Care Financial Assistance

The Early Childhood Services Bureau administers the Child Care Development Fund (CCDF). Through the CCDF, families and providers are supported in many ways:

- Equal access for families through the Best Beginnings Child Care Scholarship Program
- Reliable complaint process for families and providers
- Child Care Resource and Referral agencies across the state
- STARS to Quality, Montana's Quality Rating and Improvement System
- Health and safety standards met by all licensed providers
- Transparent licensing inspection and monitoring information

Child Care Resource and Referral (CCR&R) Agencies

The Early Childhood Services Bureau contracts with CCR&R agencies to offer the following services:

Services to Families

- Help low-income families find and pay for quality child care
- Offer referrals to licensed and registered child care programs
- Provide training, technical assistance, and support for child care providers
- Initiate projects to build quality child care
- Inform policy makers, businesses, and the public on child care related issues
- Advocate for child care providers and for families with children

Child Care Resource and Referral agencies determine eligibility for the Best Beginnings Scholarship Program for low-income families and manage state-assisted payments to providers.

Services to Providers

- Offer professional development and technical assistance to child care providers in the areas of child development, health and safety, infant and toddler care, and sound business practices
- Provide technical assistance to providers who have been referred by licensing specialists for corrective action

Child Care Licensing

The role of the Child Care Licensing Program is to regulate and monitor child care facilities. Additionally, the Program establishes guidelines for the health, safety and well-being of the children in these facilities.

STARS aligns quality indicators with support and incentives for early childhood programs and early childhood professionals. - Attend high school;
- Participate in Montana's Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program.
