HOUSEHOLD COMPOSITION

Dual Participation: Commodities/SNAP

Supersedes: FS 201-9 (05/01/2017)

Reference: 7 CFR 273.1; 7 CFR 253.7(3), 7 CFR 281.1 (C) 7 CFR 281.7a, 273.9 (C)(1), ATTACHMENT 3 TO POLICY LETTER 04-01

Overview: An individual cannot participate in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program in any month when he/she has received benefits in another state or commodities from the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR). **EXCEPTION:** Current certified SNAP household members who enter a designated abuse shelter may apply and be eligible for SNAP benefits in the same month provided that the original certified household contained the abuser. Abuse shelter residents may receive an additional benefit as a separate household only once a month (SNAP 201-8). Households certified in either FDPIR or SNAP on the first day of the month can only receive benefits in the program for which they are currently certified for the month.

NOTE:

Residents of Puerto Rico may receive benefits like SNAP benefits called NAP. When a person from Puerto Rico establishes Montana residence and applies for benefits, treat his or her Nutrition Assistance Program (NAP) as follows:

- The NAP benefit is not income, and
- SNAP benefits can be issued in Montana even if NAP was issued during the same month as the SNAP application. **NAP benefits cannot be used in the mainland United States**, so there is no duplication of benefits if SNAP is issued for the same month as NAP.

RESERVATION AND ADJACENT COUNTIES:

Until an automated match can be instituted, the following procedure has been established to prevent and detect dual participation. Form DPHHS-FD-002 'Interagency Notice of Certification/Change of Program' must be sent to the FDPIR certification office at application, recertification, closure, or when a change in household composition is reported for the following:

1. A household residing on an Indian reservation; OR

2. A household residing in the service area for FDPIR, and there is a household member that is an enrolled tribal member of any tribe. The forms shall be sent to the FDPIR program. A printout of the Person Household screen can be attached, so the demographic section does not have to be completed by the eligibility staff member.

COUNTIES OTHER THAN RESERVATION OR ADJACENT COUNTIES:

If the eligibility staff member has reason to believe the applicant/recipient might be on the FDPIR program, they should phone the FDPIR program(s). The eligibility staff member may also choose to send form DPHHS -FD- 002 to the FDPIR program.

DUAL PARTICIPATION:

If dual participation is identified, FDPIR and eligibility staff member will need to communicate to evaluate who will be responsible for pursuing the overpayment. Generally, the program that provided the duplicate benefit will be required to pursue repayment. Exceptions will be made when the participant failed to report a change in status timely or when the initial issuance site made an administrative error. **NOTE:** If the household did not report receiving commodities on the application, a

disqualification for intentional program violation (IPV) should be pursued. An individual disqualified for (IPV) from SNAP is disqualified from not only the SNAP but also from receiving commodities from FDPIR.
