Re: Waiver of Tribal Health Improvement Program (T-HIP) Reporting Requirements during COVID-19 Pandemic

Dear [Title] [Last Name]:

With the current state of emergency that exists in the State of Montana and across the nation due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Department of Public Health and Human Services is providing some additional direction related to the Tribal Health Improvement Program (T-HIP), in particular the reporting requirments outlined in the task order.

We fully understand that tribal governments have taken the necessary steps and measures to ensure their membership remain healthy and unaffected by this virus and to find ways to limit its spread across the state. As a result, many have implemented Incident Command Centers, passed tribal resolutions to close during this pandemic with only essential staff and programs operating, and many have issued their own stay at home directives in order to limit the spread, just as Governor Bullock has done for the State of Montana.

Effective immediately, the Department of Public Health and Human Services will waive the T-HIP reporting requirements through June 30, 2020. Therefore, any T-HIP Tier 1, 2 or 3 reports due for the months of April, May and June will not be required to be submitted. The department will continue to provide monthly payments to the T-HIP program and also continue to send the monthly attribution lists; however, there is no expectation during this waiver that those reports be completed and returned. Should the State of Emergency extend past June 30, 2020, the department will issue further guidance.

We value the partnership we share with you and it is important we work together to keep Montanans safe, mitigate the spread of COVID-19 and ensure reduced exposure and transmission. The Department is committed to responding to Tribal needs in these unprecedented times of the COVID-19 pandemic.
