Child Care Assistance

- The Montana Department of Public Health and Human Services offers child-care scholarships to qualified low-income families who meet eligibility requirements.
- Local Child Care Resource and Referral agencies provide referral services to families seeking child care. This includes providing parents with information regarding:
 - o Child Care openings,
 - o Location of care,
 - o Special circumstance information, such as does the provider offer extended hour service, has he/she completed accreditation process, or does he/she serve infants and toddlers.
