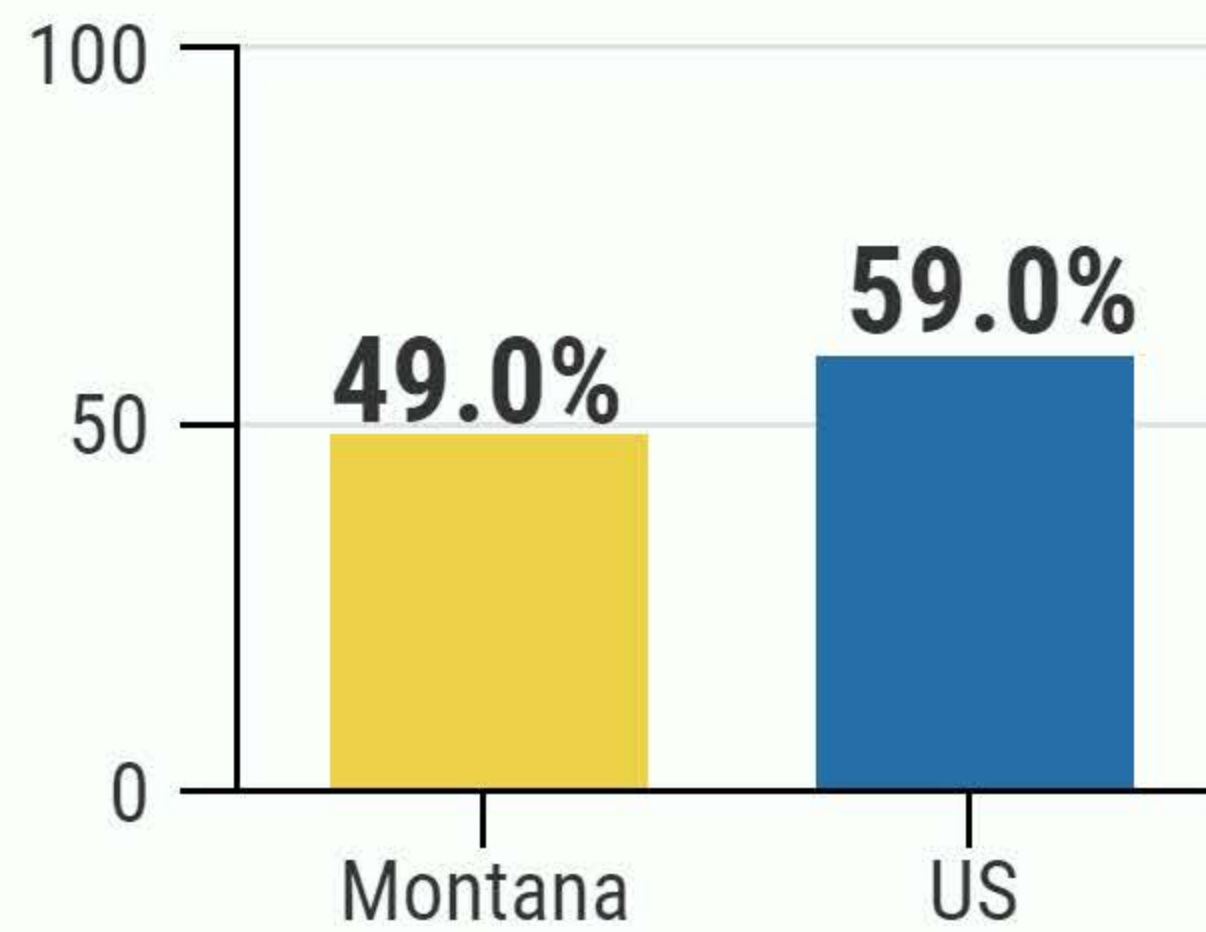

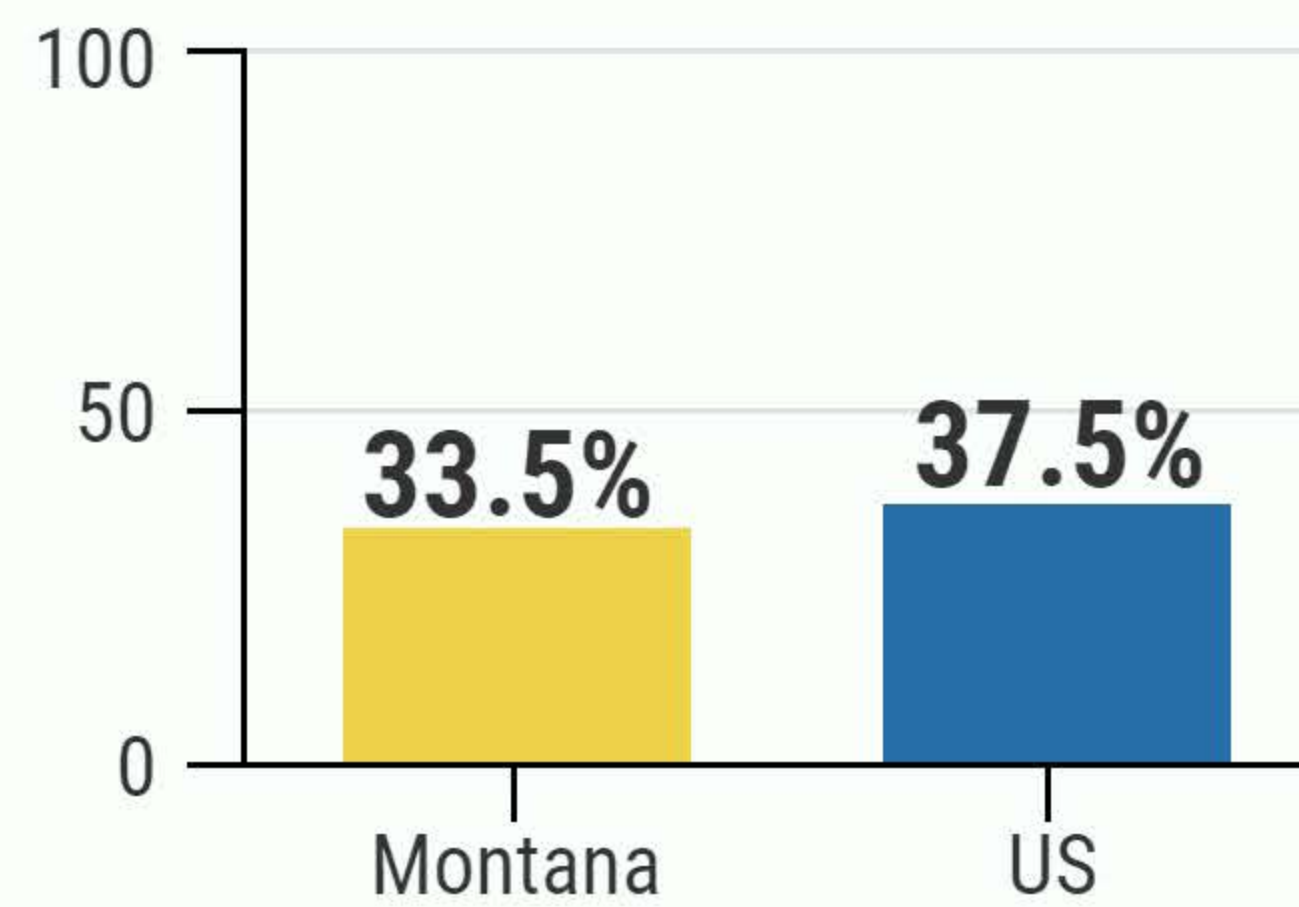


How many Montanans were vaccinated against influenza?

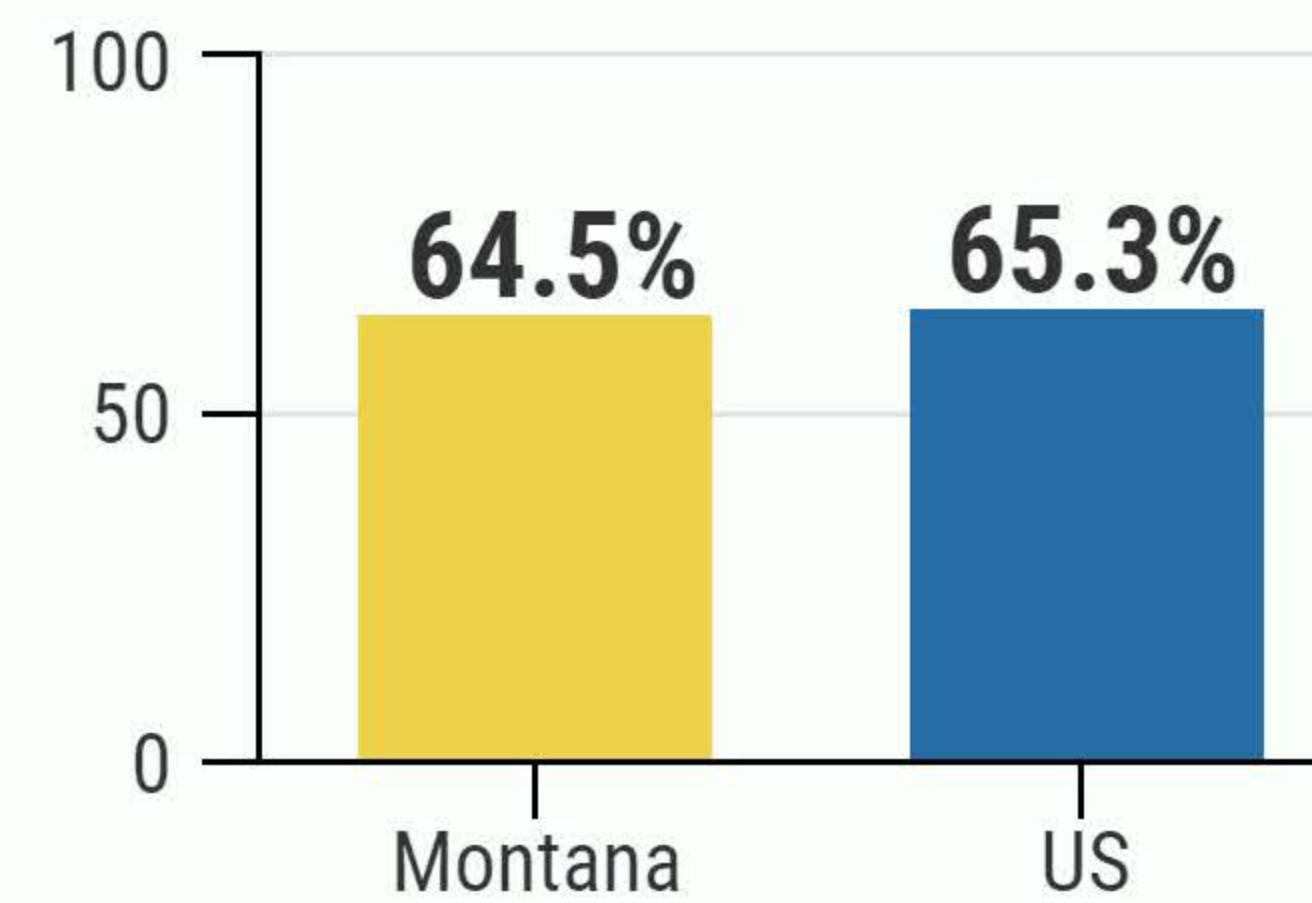
6 months-17 years



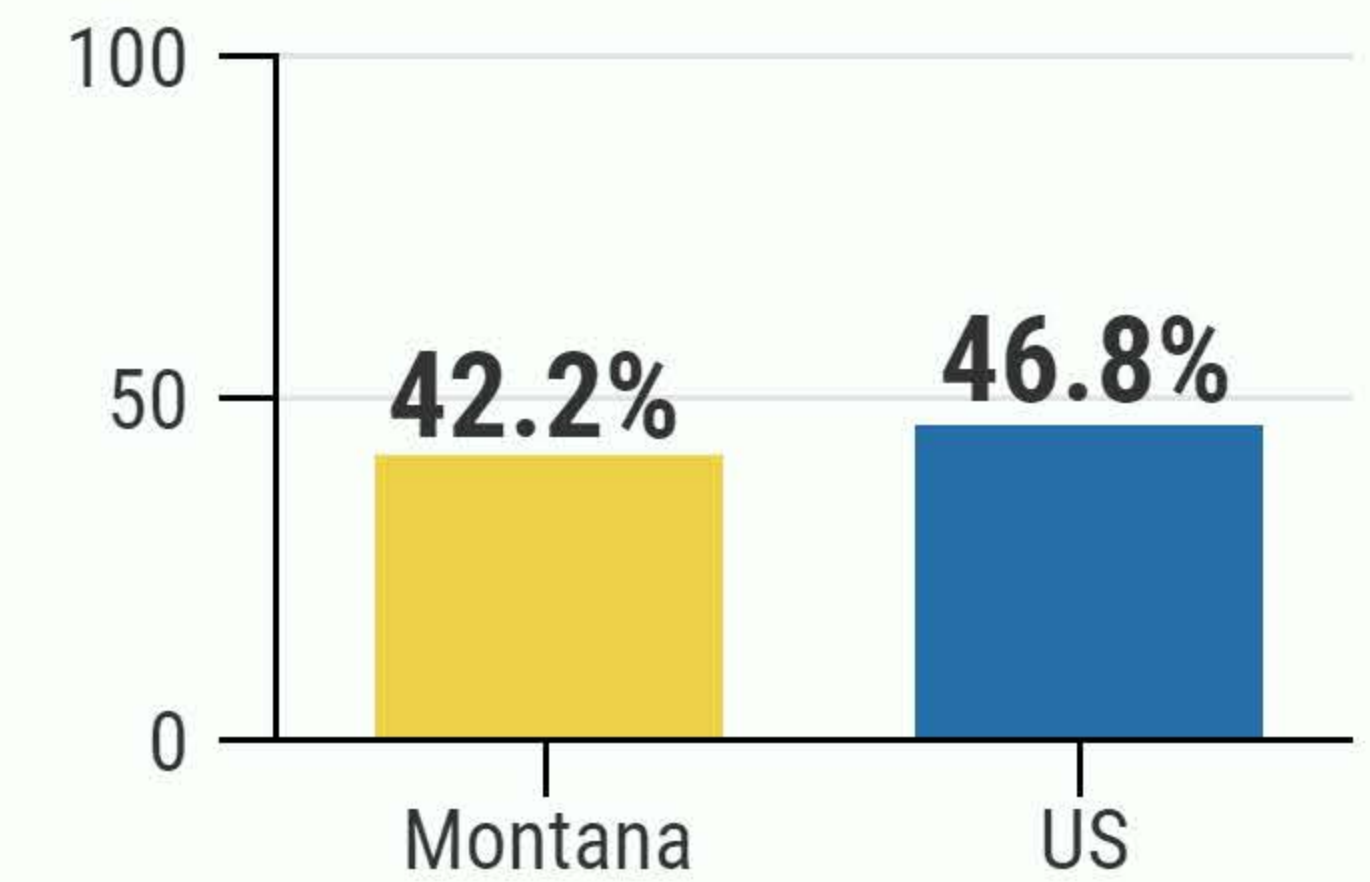
18-64 years



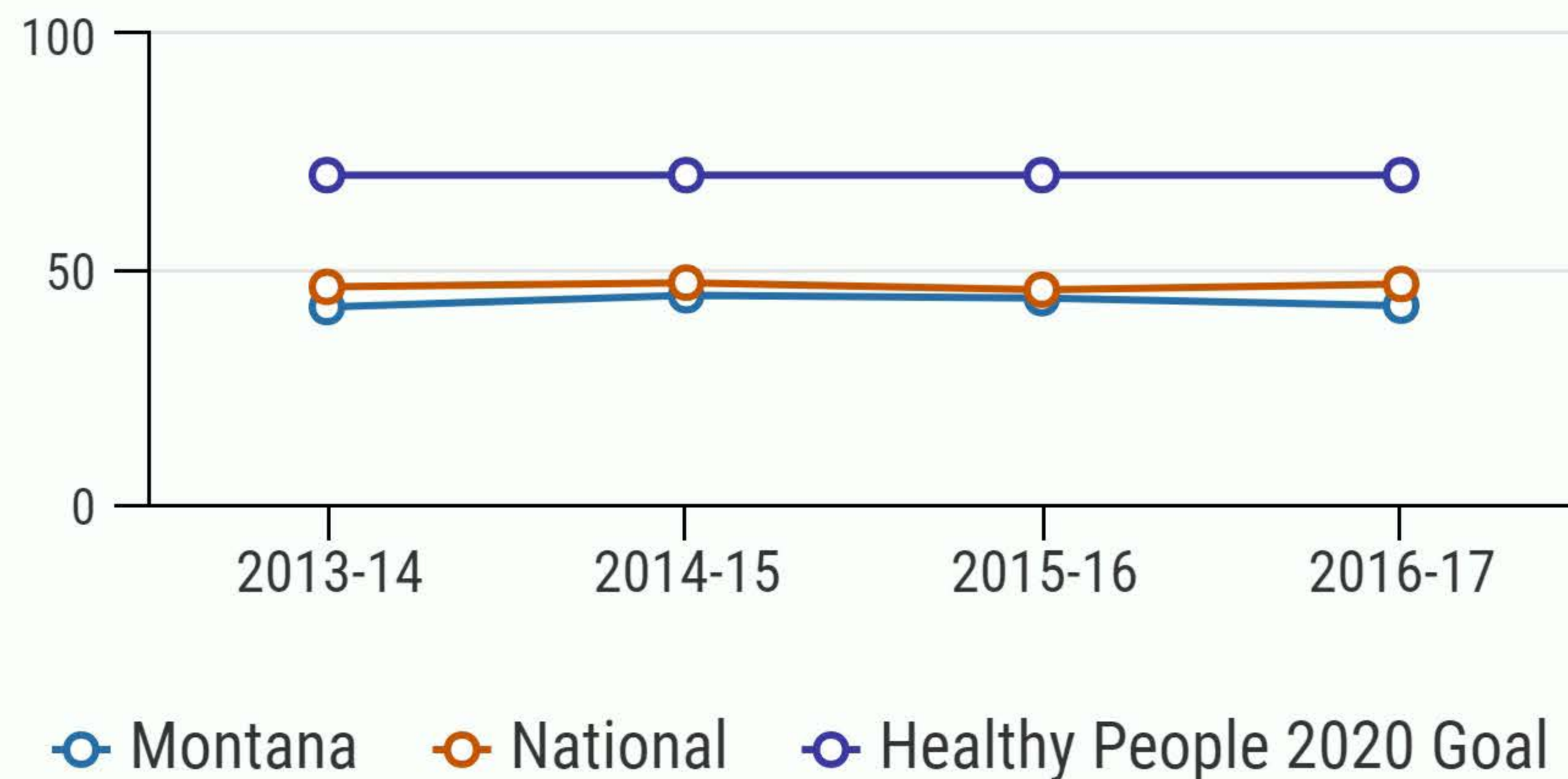
65+ years

Who needs a influenza vaccine?



Everyone 6 months and older, needs a yearly flu vaccination, especially:

- Pregnant women
- Young children
- Adults aged 65+
- People with chronic medical conditions

To date, 39% of people in the US have reported getting a flu vaccine for the current influenza season, 2017-2018. It's not too late to get your flu shot!
