



Notable Montana Communicable Disease Events of 2017

The first cases of **Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD)** were identified in Montana mule deer and white-tailed deer.

3  cases of **Tuberculosis** were reported: the lowest in state history.


48 cases of primary and secondary **syphilis** cases were reported; a **243%** increase from 2016


 The first case of documented **congenital syphilis** in Montana history was reported.


8,626  disease reports were received

The most commonly reported conditions were:

- Chlamydia
- Hepatitis C
- Gonorrhea
- Campylobacteriosis




A case of **tetanus**  was reported; the first since 2010. The individual made a full recovery.



 **86** outbreaks were reported

48% were enteric conditions

32% were influenza

The most common setting: **Long Term Care Facilities**

 An outbreak of **influenza B** in a correctional facility sickened **386**

 **234** Montanans received a recommendation for rabies post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP)
