## **Key Points:**

- In 2019, one in twelve (8%) Montana high school students reported trying cannabis for the first time before the age of 13.<sup>2</sup>
- Among adults who reported past month cannabis use in 2018, 41% reported using for medical reasons, 28% reported using for recreational purposes, and 30% reported using for both medical and recreational purposes.<sup>1</sup>
- 7% of Montana adults aged 21 or older reported driving under the influence of cannabis in the past year during 2017–2018.<sup>4</sup>
- In 2018, cannabinoids<sup>§</sup> were found in 41% DUI cases that tested for drugs, and in 15% of all vehicle crashes and 19% of all traffic fatality cases.<sup>3</sup>
- Over \$45 million dollars were charged by Montana hospitals for 4,520 cannabis-related hospitalizations and emergency department visits in 2019.<sup>¶,5</sup>

§Cannabinoids are a group of substances found in the cannabis plant. The cannabinoids tested in these data are Carboxy-THC and 11-hydroxy-THC.

¶Cannabis related hospitalizations and emergency department visits are cases where a patient either presented to an emergency department or was hospitalized and was treated for an acute or chronic condition attributable to cannabis consumption.
