

BSW 703 Services: Adult Day Health

DEFINITION

Adult Day Health provides a broad range of health, nutritional, recreational, and social services in settings outside ~~the person's a member's place of~~ residence. Adult Day Health services do not include residential overnight services.

PROVIDER REQUIREMENTS

~~Adult Day Health providers must be licensed by the Department of Health and Human Services.~~

SERVICES OFFERED BY THE ADULT DAY HEALTH CENTER SERVICE REQUIREMENTS

Adult Day Health centers must provide ~~at least one meal a day adequate nutrition to consumers members who stay participate~~ at the center ~~over 10 hours~~. Adult day health centers must provide at least one meal to clients who stay at the center up to 10 hours, and two meals per day to clients who stay at the center for over 10 hours. Snacks must be offered between meals. Transportation between the member's place of residence and the adult day health center ~~will~~ will be provided as a component part of adult day health services. The cost of transportation ~~may is be~~ included in the rate paid to providers. The center must also have a written agreement with each member or other person responsible for the ~~member consumer~~ that pertains to cost of care, type of care, services to be provided, and the manner by which the responsible party will be notified of significant changes in the member's condition and the need to seek emergency care for the member. To avoid duplication of services, the ~~Case case Management management Team team (CMT)~~ should check this agreement before approving admission to ~~determine ensure the defined responsibilities of what~~ the Adult Day Health center meet these requirements. ~~responsibility is responsible for providing.~~

SERVICE LIMITATIONS

Refer to room and board limit.

Adult Day Health services do not include residential overnight services. Adult day health services are furnished in an outpatient setting, encompassing both health and social services needed to ensure the optimal functioning of the member.

Meals provided as part of these services shall not constitute a full nutritional regiment (3 meals per day).

The scope of Adult Day Health service will not duplicate State Plan services or habilitation aid services.
