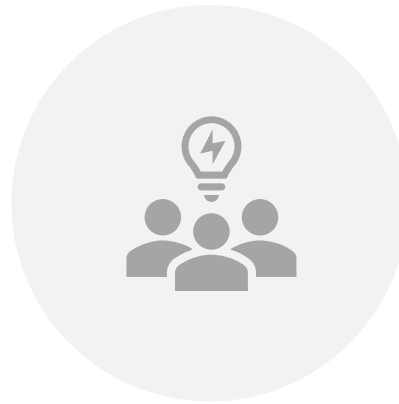
# Montana Warriors Forward Mission

- **Task** – Implement a suicide prevention program for Montana’s Servicemembers, Veterans and their Families (SMVF) that addresses the root causes of suicide through identification and screening for risk, building protective factors and facilitating care transitions for those determined to be at risk and by providing safe storage and/or disposal of lethal means for individuals in crisis.
- **Purpose** – To reduce the number of suicides among the SMVF community in Montana and to build a network of protective factors to reduce suicide risk.
- **Endstate** – The suicide rate for SMVF in Montana lowered to below the state rate and a statewide network of providers and protectors established to keep it that way.

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# HB 118 Grant

- Grants awarded (\$500K) to organizations conducting suicide prevention activities in line with evidence-based best practices.
- Past grantees have conducted work in all three of the MWF priority areas.
- Dynamic Recovery in Great Falls was awarded a grant this year, focused on veteran suicide prevention, providing training for healthcare providers, peers and on lethal means safe storage.

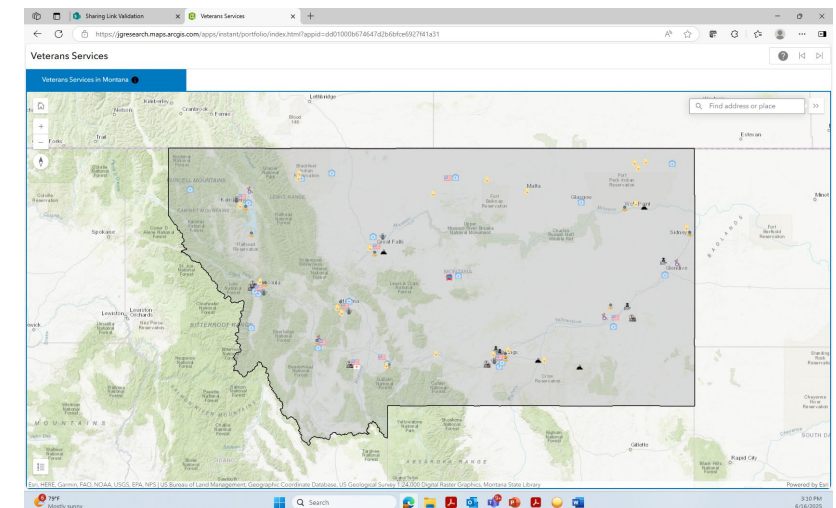
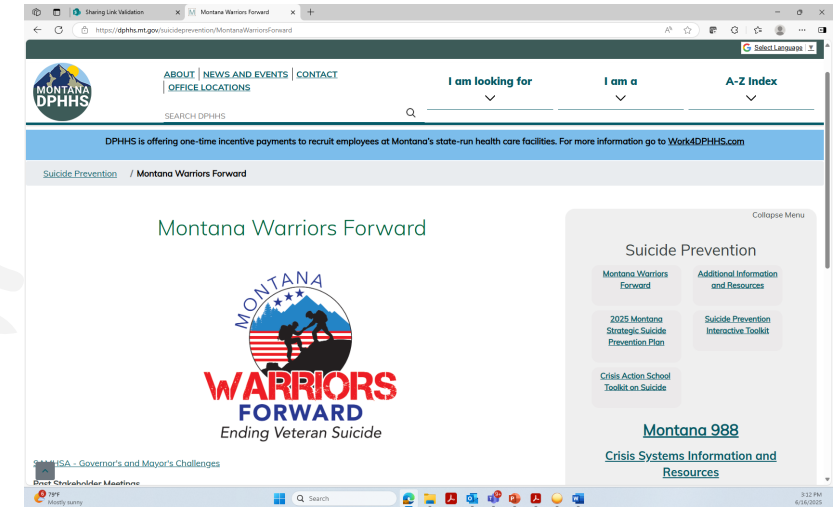
# Montana Safe Storage Initiative

- \$300K for the biennium allocated to MVAD for the safe storage of lethal means in HB2.
- MVAD and DPHHS sign an MOU transferring the funds and responsibility for executing the mission to DPHHS and MWF.
- Lewis and Clark County Public Health tasked with expanding the Safer Communities Montana (SCM) program statewide during 2026-2027.
- Three tasks: establish safe storage sites across Montana and connect them with 211 and 988; conduct safe storage training, IAW best practices; promote safe storage through media and engagement with stakeholders.

For the last 40 years, Montana has ranked among the top five states in the U.S. for suicides per capita. Suicide has a devastating effect on the people and their communities in Montana. For Montana Veterans, this issue is a major concern.

The MT 988 Veteran's Challenge is a collaborative endeavor between Montana Veterans and MSU School of Art students. The project seeks to increase knowledge and awareness around the issues of suicide and suicide prevention.

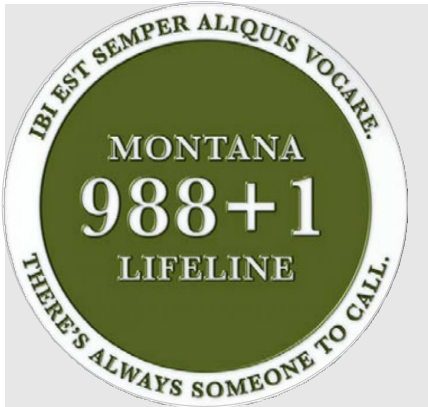
